San Diego, April 17 2013 – In consideration of the affects of sequestration, to include furlough, the due dates for submission of FY13 Expiring Funds Procurement Requests and FY14 Service Renewal Requirements with 1 October starts are now earlier for Customers of NAVSUP Global Logistics Support (GLS) and NAVSUP Fleet Logistics Centers (FLCs) Contracting Departments. The time for submission for all expiring funds requirements for contracts over \$1M has already passed, per our GLS Customer Advisory 22-12 dated 19 Nov 12 and GLS Naval message DTG 152310ZNOV12 . Any emergent requirements over \$1M will be considered on a case by case basis by each servicing FLC within the bounds/timelines set forth by law and regulation. For expiring funds requirements under \$1M, revised submission dates follow:

NAVSUP GLS/NAVSUP FLC Contracting Departments are anticipating a sharp decrease in contracting capacity during our 4<sup>th</sup> quarter peak period due to sequestration impacts (late release of customer funding, need for funding obligation approval, hiring freeze/contracting vacancies, no overtime/compensatory time, and potential furlough). As a result, customers are requested to prioritize requirements and submit your Requests for Contractual Procurement (RCPs) to your servicing FLC as early as possible before pending furlough is implemented and contracting capacity reached. Early submission of RCPs will enable us to leverage our limited resources to best meet customer needs. We further recommend Contracting customers have a backup plan for spending expiring funds in the event the worst case scenario is realized.

RCPs received after the **revised due dates** noted above will require review by NAVSUP FLC Chief of the Contracting Office (CCO) to assess feasibility of completion based on staffing capacity and statutory competition requirements. If accepted, the NAVSUP FLC will make every effort possible to award the contract; but acceptance of late requirements does not guarantee obligation, except for truly urgent requirements (e.g. CA REP, NMCS/PMCS, work stoppage, safety).

## PERSONNEL SUPPORT DETACHMENT

**MULTIPLE EXIT/REENTRY** stamp issued by PSD when proof of SOFA status is stamped on the passport. SOFA STAMP may be provided by:

1. Airport Immigration upon entry to Japan.
2. Having possession of NO-FEE passport containing an endorsement indicating status as an employee or dependent of an employee of the U.S. government stationed in Japan.
3. Japanese Immigration cancelling previous VISA (i.e. tourist/visitor) with endorsement "CANCELLED UNDER THE STATUS OF FORCES AGREEMENT"

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**INITIAL/RENEWED TOURIST PASSPORT (US)**

- If applying for TOURIST passport (initial or renewal) and applicant does not have a NO-FEE passport, applicant must obtain SOFA stamp from the U.S. Embassy. Official ID card, Original Letter of Dependency and old passport is required. **NOTE:** Inform the embassy to place the SOFA stamp before issuing the passport to prevent another trip back to the US Embassy.

**INITIAL/RENEWED TOURIST PASSPORT:** (Foreign, except Japanese passport)

- Obtain SOFA stamp from the U.S. Embassy. Official ID card and Original Letter of Dependency is required. The "Official Military Personnel File (OMPF) My Record" was added to the Sailor Career Toolbox [here](#).



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# Emergency Management



It is that time of year again—Typhoon Season!! A typhoon is a type of tropical cyclone, which is a general term for a circulating weather system over tropical waters. In the Northern Hemisphere they circulate counter-clockwise. Of the 10 tropical storms that occur each year, on the average, 6 will become typhoons, developing in the Pacific Ocean. The typhoon threat has been low over the past 20-30 years but typhoons, like other, weather patterns come in cycles. Your best defense is to prepare yourself, your family and your community

The Base Information Channel (BIC), FEN, 810 KHz (EAGLE 810 radio station) and the official NAF Atsugi Facebook page are great sources for current storm information.

Listen for the following watches and warning:

- Tropical Cyclone Condition of Readiness IV (TCCOR 4). Destructive winds of 50 knots or greater are possible within 72 hours.
- Tropical Cyclone Condition of Readiness III (TCCOR 3). Destructive winds of 50 knots or greater are possible within 48 hours.
- Tropical Cyclone Condition of Readiness II (TCCOR 2). Destructive winds of 50 knots or greater are anticipated within 24 hours.
- Tropical Cyclone Condition of Readiness I (TCCOR 1). Destructive winds 50 knots or greater are anticipated within 12 hours.
- Tropical Cyclone Condition of Readiness I Caution (TCCOR 1 CAUTION). Destructive winds of 34-49 knots are occurring at NAF Atsugi.
- Tropical Cyclone Condition of Readiness I Emergency (TCCOR 1 EMERGENCY). Destructive winds of 50 knots or greater are occurring at NAF Atsugi.

There are additional TCCOR levels assigned for time periods occurring after the storm. For additional information, refer to the NAF Atsugi Instruction 3140.1R Heavy Weather Doctrine. Check out the Typhoon Family Checklist that is Enclosure 1 of the instruction.

## Before the Typhoon Season Begins:

Families should review the Typhoon Family Checklist each April and should maintain a copy in their homes for easy reference throughout the typhoon season.

1. Stock a three day supply of canned food that can be used in case of a typhoon.
2. Make sure all doors and windows are in proper working order.
3. Keep a portable transistor radio, flashlights, batteries, candles, bottled water, matches, and a first aid kit in your home. Each home should also have a means of emergency portable cooking such as a small stove and an adequate supply of cooking fuel.
4. Inspect the general condition of your quarters for broken or loose items. Look for broken roof tiles, broken or cracked windows, doors that will not latch securely, improperly secured stovepipes or TV antennas, etc. Arrange for repair of unsafe items.
5. Check with your command to determine if you are a part of the home share program. If you live off base, locate your designated on base shelter.

Please help us to prevent further incidents by observing the following safety tips for everyone:

1. Store matches and lighters out of children's reach and sight, preferably in a locked cabinet.
2. Never use lighters or matches as a source of amusement for children; THEY WILL IMITATE YOU.
3. If your child expresses curiosity about fire or has been playing with fire, calmly but firmly explain that matches and lighters are tools for adults only.
4. Use only lighter designed with child-resistant features. Remember child resistant does not mean child proof.
5. Teach young children and school age children to tell an adult if they see matches lighters.
6. Never leave matches or lighters in a bedroom or any place where children may go without supervision.
